Sealed bids in single copy for furnishing all labor, materials and equipment, and performing all work on Project No. 5054-0091 Unalakleet Village Street, described herein, will be received until 2:00 p.m. prevailing time, July 9, 1981 in the Division Director's Office, Design and Construction, Island Center Building, Douglas, Alaska.

This project will consist of upgrading and construction of 2.40 miles of roadway.

Principal items of work consist of the following: 15,000 cubic yards vehicle measure of borrow, 4,600 cubic yards of vehicle measure of subbase grading "C-2". Lump sum items include construction surveying by the contractor.

All work shall be completed in 90 Calendar Days.

In accordance with requirements set forth by the "Federal Highway Administration", the following provisions are made a part of all advertisements for highway construction contracts:

"The Department has established a total Female and Minority Business Enterprise (FMBE) participation goal of 20.7 percent for this project. Construction of 2.40 miles of roadway, 92 percent for firms owned and controlled by minorities and 0.0 percent for firms owned and controlled by women.

Where no goals are specified for a project, bidders must submit certifications stating whether or not they intend to subcontract a portion of the work and, if so, that they have taken affirmative action to seek out and consider female and minority as potential subcontractors. Each bidder shall submit a completed FMBE Certification Form 25A-320 8/80, attached to the original proposal. It will not be considered with or without a completed Form 25A-326 attached.

Where percentage goals are specified for a project, bidders must submit a completed Female and Minority Business Enterprise Report Form 26A-326 5/81, attached to the original proposal. It will not be considered without a completed Form 25A-326 attached."

Forms 25A-320 or 25A-326 will be included with the bidding documents.

Bidders that submit false information on that fail to meet Female and Minority Enterprise Goals and fail to demonstrate sufficient reasonable efforts shall not be eligible to be awarded the contract.

DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES DIVISION OF PIPELINE SURVEILLANCE NOTICE OF AMENDMENT TO PIPELINE RIGHT-OF-WAY LEASE APPLICATION ADL NOS. 403427 and 403291

On March 18, 1981, an application for lease of state lands for the Alaska Gas Conditioning Facility at Prudhoe Bay was filed by Northwest Alaskan Pipeline Company, as Operator for parties to a cooperative agreement of June 20, 1980, with the Commissioner of the Department of Natural Resources, Prudhoe Bay, Alaska 99801. This application is deemed an amendment to the application for a pipeline right-of-way lease across state lands for a natural gas pipeline filed April 15, 1981, ADL No. 40327, by Alaskan Northwest Natural Gas Company. Public notice of the earlier application was given on May 1, 1981. Notice is given of the filing of this amendment pursuant to Alaska Statutes 38.35, 37.0 and 38.35.020(c).

General Description of Lands Involved

The land which the applicant has requested leased is located in Township 11N, Range 14E, Umatier Meridian, Sections 1, 2, 3, 9, 10, 11, 14, 15, 16, 17, 19, 20, 22, 29, 30, 32, and 33. The land is located in the Prudhoe Bay, Alaska, and encompasses approximately 2,000 acres in the North Slope Borough.

Summary of the Application

The applicant proposes to use the lands described to construct and operate a natural gas conditioning plant. The purpose of the Alaska Gas Conditioning Facility is to condition the natural gas to pipeline quality for transportation to the Lower 48 States. In addition to the Alaska Gas Conditioning Facility, the applicant proposes to construct four miles of intersecting road and pipeline and will provide housing and other

infrastructure for operations personnel and construction labor force. Completion of the project is anticipated in 1985.

Construction of the Alaska Gas Conditioning Facility is to be based on a modular selflift approach. Approximately 250 modules will be fabricated outside the State of Alaska and transported by barge to Prudhoe Bay. The modules will be placed on a constructed gravel pad of approximately 140 acres.

The applicant proposes to build for access roads for construction and operation activities. Further, the applicant has requested right-of-way for three miles of the NGL Right-of-Way from the Alaska Gas Conditioning Facility past the Soho Central Power Station to the Crude Oil Cooling Facility; the Field Fuel Gas Line Right-of-Way which will connect the NGL line and terminate at TAPS Pump Station No. 1; and the NGL (Injection) Right-of-Way from the Alaska Gas Conditioning Facility to the North Gas Injection Site.
