The Alaska Native Leadership Project is an educational program which provides an opportunity for its participants to make a conscious effort to actualize self-determination through continuous learning.

The program focuses on personal development, State government, Alaska Native issues, and management and organizational skill building techniques.

Participants will attend four one-week training sessions and will be encouraged to serve an internship with an organization which can best provide them the exposure and awareness-building experiences necessary to highlight the skill-building components of the ANLP program.

All applicants will be considered on an individual basis according to his/her demonstrated interest, community awareness, and leadership potential. Applicant interviews will begin during the Alaska Federation of Natives Convention, October 20, 21, and 22, 1983.



The Alaska Native Leadership Project will provide travel, lodging, course fees and materials. Participants will be responsible for food and miscellaneous expenses. All participants are encouraged to seek a sponsoring organization to help defray these expenses.

The major requirements for application to the ANLP program are to:

- 1. Complete and return the ANLP Application by 25th October, 1983.
- 2. Acquire a letter of support from a Community Leader or your employer as a reference.
