

BLM Conveys Land To Golovin

The Bureau of Land Management conveyed 88,457 acres to Golovin Native Corp. October 9, under terms of the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act. The Bering Straits Native Corp. received the subsurface rights to the land.

The acreage is in the vicinity of the village of Golovin, on the Seward Peninsula about 75 miles west of Nome. Golovin is

one of the 29 villages in the Bristol Bay region. Thus far the BLM has conveyed land to two other villages in the region, Brevig Mission and White Mountain, and to two reserves, the Elim Reserve and the St. Lawrence Reserve.

The Golovin conveyance is the 109th village conveyance for BLM and marks the halfway point in land conveyances to the state's eligible villages.
