Three untitled watercolor and ink paintings by James Kivatoruk Moses have been donated to the Anchorage Museum of History and Art by the Anchorage Museum Association.

Moses is considered one of the best

Alaska Native artists who depicted myths and legends in his work and traditional life as he knew it.

Among other donations to the museum by the Anchorage Museum Association is an argillite and pewter

"flute" or recorder, believed to have been created by Haida carver George Gunyo between 1835 and 1865.

There are only two dozen known examples of this type of piece, inspired
