

ADF&G issues notice of errors in hunting booklets

The Alaska Department of Fish and Game has issued a notice that the current booklet for hunting regulations contains errors.

Contrary to what is stated on page 34, moose hunters intending to hunt the area outside of the Naknek River drainage in Subunit 9(C) on the Alaska Peninsula are advised that there is no December antlerless season for non-subsistence hunters.

Resident, nonsubsistence hunters may take only bull moose during the month of December.

An additional error concerns brown bear hunting in Unit 6. Although page 23 of regulations indicates a closed season in Subunit 6(D) and a May 25 closing date in Subunit 6(A), in fact all of Unit 6 has an open brown bear season which runs from September 1 to May 31.

Other errors involve coyote, wolverine and squirrel hunting. Con-

trary to what page 41 of the regulations states, a year-long coyote season with no bag limit exists only for Subunits 6(C) and 6(B).

Subunits 6(A) and 6(D), together with Units 1-5 and 7-26, have a Sept. 1-April 30 season with a bag limit of two coyotes.

In the case of wolverine, Units 1-5 have a Nov. 10-Feb. 15 season with a bag limit of one wolverine. Units 6-26, except Subunit 14(C) within Chugach State Park, have a bag limit of one wolverine during a Sept. 1-March 31 season.

Wolverine hunting is closed within the Chugach State Park portion of Subunit 14(C).

The squirrel hunting regulation indicates no closed season with no limit in Units 1-26 for all squirrels. In fact, this regulation applies only to red squirrels. There is no open season on ground or flying squirrels.
