Public Awareness Objectives:

1. To make the general public aware of programs and services being offered by the CED/JOM Programs.
2. To achieve a keener awareness of how the public (including the Alaska Native Subcommunity) perceives CED/JOM Programs.

Public and Political Support Objectives:

1. To educate public officials (Administrators and Legislators) about the positive benefits accomplished through the JOM Programs.
2. To enlist the support of public officials for JOM Programs.
3. To generate support for JOM Programs among the general public.
4. To create an awareness of support for the CED/JOM Programs among CINA staff and its membership.

Anticipated Budget:

The anticipated budget for the project will be approximately \$12,000.00. A specific contract amount will be negotiated prior to signing the project contract.

Contract Policy:

It is the policy of the Cook Inlet Native Association to exercise Indian Preference in accordance with Public Law 93-638 Section 7 (b) which states:

Any contract, sub-contract, grant or sub-grant pursuant to this Act, the Act of April 16, 1938 (48 Stat. 596) as amended, or any other Act authorizing federal contracts with or grants to Indian organizations or for the benefit of Indians, shall require to the greatest extent feasible ---

- (1) Preferences and opportunities for training and employment in connection with the administration of such contracts or grants shall be given to Indians.

Contract Approval and Deadline:

Contract proposals shall be submitted to the Cook Inlet Native Association no later than 5:00 p.m. Friday, January 14, 1983 and reviewed, rejected and/or approved by the CED/JOM Program in consultation with the Native Education Committee (NEC) Parent Advisory Board.

Alaska Native Claims Selection

The purpose of this decision is to modify page 13902 of the FEDERAL REGISTER, April 1, 1982 and Item 2 of page 4 of the decision dated March 31, 1982, to include the following Sec. 17(b) easement reservation.

25 FOOT TRAIL - The uses allowed on a twenty-five (25) foot wide trail easement are: travel by foot, dogsled, animals, snowmobiles, two- and three-wheel vehicles, and small all-terrain vehicles (less than 3,000 lbs. Gross Vehicle Weight (GVW)).

(EIN 2 C3, D1) An easement for an existing access trail twenty-five (25) feet in width from a point in Sec. 26, T. 6 N., R. 73 W., Seward Meridian, southerly to the village of Eek. The uses allowed are those listed above for a twenty-five (25) foot wide trail easement. This trail is limited to winter use only.

On October 15, 1982 the State Director Memo concerning navigability was amended to include an unnamed slough from its mouth on the Kuskokwim River in Sec. 1, T. 6 N., R. 73 W., Seward Meridian, easterly to a point on the easterly boundary of Sec. 25, T. 7 N., R. 71 W., Seward Meridian, as a navigable water body.

The submerged lands underlying the above unnamed slough are hereby excluded from the lands approved for conveyance to Napaskiak Incorporated.

Except as modified by this decision, the decision of March 31, 1982 stands as written.

In accordance with Departmental regulation 43 CFR 2650.7(d), notice of this decision is being published once in the FEDERAL REGISTER and once a week, for four (4) consecutive weeks, in THE TUNDRA DRUMS.

Any party claiming a property interest in lands affected by this decision, an agency of the Federal government, or regional corporation may appeal the decision to the Interior Board of Land Appeals, Office of Hearings and Appeals, in accordance with the attached regulations in title 43 CODE OF FEDERAL REGULATIONS (CFR), Part 4, Subpart E, as revised. However, pursuant to Public Law 96-487, this decision constitutes the final administrative determination of the Bureau of Land Management concerning navigability of water bodies.

If an appeal is taken the notice of appeal must be filed in the Bureau of Land Management, Alaska State Office, Division of ANCSA and State Conveyances (960), 701 C Street, Box 13, Anchorage, Alaska 99513. Do not send the appeal directly to the Interior Board of Land Appeals. The appeal and copies of pertinent case files will be sent to the Board from this office. A copy of the appeal must be served upon the Regional Solicitor, 701 C Street, Box 34, Anchorage, Alaska 99513.

The time limits for filing an appeal are:

1. Parties receiving service of this decision by personal service of certified mail, return receipt requested, shall have 30 days from receipt of this decision to file an appeal.
2. Unknown parties, parties unable to be located after reasonable efforts have been expended to locate, parties who failed or refused to sign the return receipt and parties who received a copy of this decision by regular mail which is not certified, return receipt requested, shall have until January 19, 1983 to file an appeal.

Any party known or unknown who is adversely affected by this decision shall be deemed to have waived those rights which were adversely affected unless an appeal is timely filed with the Bureau of Land Management, Alaska State Office, Division of ANCSA and State Conveyances. To avoid summary dismissal of the

appeal, there must be strict compliance with the regulations governing such appeals. Further information on the manner of and requirements for filing an appeal may be obtained from the Bureau of Land Management, 701 C Street, Box 13, Anchorage, Alaska 99513. Notice of Preliminary Decision, Classification, Reclassification and Mineral Closing Orders for Potential Land Disposal Areas

The State of Alaska, as part of an ongoing land disposal program, is proposing to offer approximately 11,770 acres as potential remote parcel lands, 2,730 acres of subdivision lands within the Southcentral District to the general public.

Pursuant to A.S. 38.05.345(b) NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Alaska Division of Land and Water Management has made "Written Findings" determining that it is in the State's best interest to consider the disposal of lands referred to in this notice. The "Written Findings" are available for public review during normal business hours at the Southcentral District Office, Lands Section, 9th Floor, Frontier Building, 3601 C Street, Anchorage, Alaska. Additionally, the lands are to be classified or reclassified as Private Recreation or agriculture to facilitate its disposal. Also, the lands are to be closed to mineral entry pursuant to A.S. 38.05.185 to assist in preventing conflicts with surface survey and land disposal. If requested prior to the end of the comment period a public hearing will be held on the proposed actions at the request of at least twenty-five (25) Alaskan residents. Any comments, objections or expressions of interest regarding these proposed actions must be received by the Division of Land and Water Management at the above address on or before 4:30 p.m., January 27, 1983 in order to be considered.

Remote Parcel Program
State lands in the following areas are proposed to be available for entry, lease and subsequent sale under A.S. 38.05.077:

Itullik Remote: Located approximately 240 air miles west of Anchorage and approximately 120 air miles southwest of McGrath along the Hoholtna River. The area encompasses approximately 9,120 acres within portions of Sections 6, 7 and 18 Township 15 North, Range 42 West, Seward Meridian and within Sections 1, 2, 11, 12, 13, 14, 23, 24, 25, 26, 35 and 36, Township 15 North, Range 43 West, Seward Meridian.
