

# Exhibits sought for Earth, Fire, Fibre show

All Alaskan artist who work in the media of clay, fibre, metal, bone and ivory, plastics, wood, glass or stone are invited to submit their work to Earth, Fire and Fibre XII, the annual statewide juried craft exhibition organized by the Anchorage Historical and Fine Arts Museum.

There will be \$4,000 in awards, entries permitting, plus purchase awards by the Anchorage Museum, the Alaska State Museum and the Contemporary Art Bank of the Alaska State Council on the Arts.

The juror for this year's exhibition will be Ruth de Young Kohler, Director of the John Michael Kohler Arts Center in

Sheboygan, Wisconsin and crafts panelist for the National Endowment for the Arts.

The deadline for acceptance of entries is Sept. 25. There is no entry fee. Prospectuses are available at the Museum and at local museums and arts councils throughout the State.

Earth, Fire and Fibre XII will open on Oct. 18, and remain on view through Nov. 25. Following the exhibition here, portions of the show will travel throughout the state for six months. The exhibition is supported by a grant from the Alaska State Council on the Arts and the National Endowment for the Arts in Washington, D.C., a federal agency created by an act of Congress in 1965.
