

Kenaitze culture display

The Seward Ranger District of the Chugach National Forest has signed an agreement with the Kenaitze Indian Tribe to operate an interpretive site at milepost 54.5 of the Sterling Highway.

The Kenaitze Tribe will be providing interpreters to staff the site seven days a week from the end of May until the beginning of September. The interpreters will present programs on topics such as the Dena'ina culture, bird and plant identification, fish facts and the value of archeological sites. Interpreters will also, at various times, be put-

ting on interpretive programs and interpretive walks. The Forest Service will be providing training for the site staff in interpretation, CPR and first aid, housing for the Kenaitze Tribe youth group members working at the site, toilet facilities,

and tools and materials to aid in the interpretation and protection of the site.

The Forest Service and the Kenaitze Indian Tribe also plan to provide an interpretive brochure and to work together in interpreting and protecting valuable cultural resources.
