



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PUBLIC NOTICE OF PRELIMINARY ENGINEERING AND ENVIRONMENTAL STUDIES AND WETLANDS AND FLOODPLAIN INVOLVEMENT PROJECT NO. 57984 HOOPER BAY AIRPORT IMPROVEMENTS

The Alaska Department of Transportation and Public Facilities (ADOT&PF) is proceeding with preliminary engineering and environmental studies for the proposed improvements at Hooper Bay Airport, Hopoper Bay, Alaska. The proposed project would involve emplacement of fill in wetlands and floodplains as defined by Executive Order 11990, Protection of Wetlands and Executive Order 11988, Floodplain Management. The purpose of the project is to bring Hooper Bay up to current standards and to resurface the runway.

The proposed project consists of resurfacing the runway and apron expansion. The apron expansion will be a maximum of 150,000 square feet. These improvements would involve placement of a total of 11,000 c.y. of fill into approximately 2 acres of palustrine wetlands.

To ensure that all possible factors are considered in the design of the proposed project, ADOT&PF is requesting public comments and recommendations. Please send your comments to the following address by November 30, 1989.
