

Bond Propositions

Alaskan voters gave their stamp of approval Tuesday to ten bond issue propositions, which will finance a number of sorely needed facilities ranging from rural schools to health care facilities.

The largest of these, proposition 9, includes a total of \$40,377,000 for 55 rural school projects. About \$7 million will go for past debts from cost overruns on construction or new school construction.

• Individual projects include \$3.2 million for elementary and secondary school construction in Galena; \$2.8 million for an elementary-secondary school in Upper Kobuk Valley; \$2.3 million for a similar facility at Kivalina; \$2.2 million for an elementary school Kongiganak; \$1.5 million for school construction at Northway and \$1.3 million for a school addition at Delta.

Savoonga will get \$1 million, as will Sand Point, the

latter for an area high school while \$2 million will go for a secondary school at Kenny Lake.

Proposition 1 includes \$217 million for seven capital improvements associated with fire protection programs under the Department of Natural Resources. Proposition 2 includes \$22.5 million for port facilities and Proposition 3, \$7.9 million for library resource centers and community programs. Proposition 4 totals \$10.4 million for 56 airports projects and Proposition 5 has \$37.4 million for transportation, including \$8 million for local roads and trails.

Proposition 6 contains \$10.9 million for health care facilities and Proposition 7, \$10.5 million for 27 fish and game projects. Proposition 8 takes in \$7.5 million for pioneer home projects in Palmer, Anchorage and Kotzebue. Proposition 10 includes 54 projects under the University of Alaska totaling \$39,523,000.
