## FOOD STAMP HOTLINE

The Division of Public Assistance is studying the cost of offering a toll-free telephone service that Alaskans could call for information that is otherwise only available by contacting the local public assistance office or fee agent. This information would include:

1. An explanation of what the Food Stamp Program is and what recent changes have been made.
2. How and where to apply for food stamps.
3. Hours when the local food stamp office is open.
4. A service for making complaints about the food stamp office, workers, the application process, or other problems with food stamps.

NOTE: The hotline operator could not give information about individual food stamp cases or take messages about changes for individual food stamp households.
