**NOTICE OF NEW NATIVE LAND EASEMENT PROCEDURES**  
Section 17(b) of the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act of December 18, 1971 (85 Stat. 688), authorizes the Secretary of the Interior, after consultation with the State of Alaska and the Joint Federal-State Land Use Planning Commission, to reserve such public easements across lands selected under ANCSA as he determines are necessary to guarantee access to public lands and major waterways and to guarantee international treaty obligations.  
Following litigation, new easement regulations setting forth new criteria were issued on November 27, 1978, (43 FR 55326). Existing easement reservations and recommendations must be conformed to the new criteria. Among other things, the new criteria provides for site easements rather than continuous linear easements along the marine coastline and many inland waterways, and for the elimination of easements based solely on recreational use. Easement reservations and recommendations previously submitted for specified villages will be considered in the conformance process.

The purpose of this notice is to inform the public that the Bureau of Land Management is currently conforming existing easement reservations and recommendations to the new regulations. All interested parties should contact the appropriate District Office to obtain the schedule for conformance so that new information concerning access related easements may be submitted to the District Manager, at the Bureau of Land Management, Anchorage District Office, 4700 E. 72nd Avenue, Anchorage, Alaska 99507 or the Bureau of Land Management, Fairbanks District Office, P.O. Box 1150, Fairbanks, Alaska 99707.  
In most cases, as specific Native selection areas are being reconsidered under the new regulations, a second opportunity will be provided for public recommendations for access related easements. This will be extended through a 30-day notice issued at the discretion of the authorizing officer.
