The total acreage approved for conveyance in Part I, Land Outside NPR-A is 35,959 acres and Part II, Land Within or Outside NPR-A is 7,930 acres.

Sections 1, 2, 10, and 11, of T. 12 N., R. 6 E., Umiat Meridian, containing 1,574 acres, are deleted from this decision and are not being approved for conveyance at this time. Also, further action on State Selection F-031802 as to these lands will be taken at a later date. Therefore, the total acreage being approved for conveyance to Kuupik Corporation, Inc. is 48,026 acres. The remaining entitlement of approximately 24,433 acres will be conveyed at a later date.

The paragraph excluding certain water bodies which now reads:

Excluded from the above-described lands herein approved for conveyance are the submerged lands in the bed of the Colville River and in the beds of the Nechelek Channel, Kupigruak Channel, Elaktoveach Channels, Tamayayak Channel, and Sakoonang Channel; these lands are reserved in public ownership, pursuant to Sec. 1431(n), Public Law 96-487 of December 2, 1980.

Is hereby modified to read as follows:

Excluded from the above-described lands and the acreage herein approved for conveyance are the submerged lands in the bed of the Colville River and in the beds of the Nechelek Channel, Kupigruak Channel, Elaktoveach Channels, Tamayayak Channel, and Sakoonang Channel; these lands are reserved in public ownership, pursuant to Sec. 1431(n), Public Law 96-487 of December 2, 1980. Also excluded is the Nanuk Lake which is considered, because of its physical setting, a part of the Colville River.

Except as modified by this decision, the Decision of September 30, 1982 stands as written and those lands not affected by this modification will be conveyed when the decision of September 30, 1982 is final.

In accordance with Departmental regulation 43 CFR 2650.7(d), notice of this decision is being published once in the FEDERAL REGISTER and once a week, for four (4) consecutive weeks, in the TUNDRA TIMES.

Any party claiming a property interest in lands affected by this decision, an agency of the Federal government, or regional corporation may appeal the decision to the Interior Board of Land Appeals, Office of Hearings and Appeals in accordance with the attached regulations in Title 43 CODE OF FEDERAL REGULATIONS (CFR), Part 4, Subpart E, as revised. However, pursuant to Public Law 96-487 this decision constitutes the final administrative determination of the Bureau of Land Management concerning navigability of water bodies.

If an appeal is taken the notice of appeal must be filed in the Bureau of Land Management, Alaska State Office, Division of ANCSA and State Conveyances (960), 701 C Street, Box 13, Anchorage, Alaska 99513. Do not send the appeal directly to the Interior Board of Land Appeals. The appeal and copies of pertinent case files will be sent to the Board from this office. A copy of the appeal must be served upon the Regional Solicitor, 701 C Street, Box 34, Anchorage, Alaska 99513.

The time limits for filing an appeal are:

1. Parties receiving service of this decision shall have thirty days from receipt of this decision to file an appeal.
2. Unknown parties, parties unable to be located after reasonable efforts have been expended to locate, and parties who failed or refused to sign the return receipt shall have until December 6, 1982 to file an appeal.

Any party known or unknown who is adversely affected by this decision shall be deemed to have waived those rights which were adversely affected unless an appeal is timely filed with the Bureau of Land Management, Alaska State Office, Division of ANCSA and State Conveyances.

To avoid summary dismissal of the appeal, there must be strict compliance with the regulations governing such appeals. Further information on the manner of and requirements for filing an appeal may be obtained from the Bureau of Land Management, 701 C Street, Box 13 Anchorage, Alaska 99513.

#### NOTICE OF PROPOSED CHANGES IN THE REGULATIONS OF THE COMMERCIAL FISHERIES ENTRY COMMISSION

Notice is hereby given that the Alaska Commercial Fisheries Entry Commission, under authority vested by AS 16.43.020 and AS 16.43.110, proposes to adopt, amend and repeal regulations in Title 20, Chapter 5 of the Alaska Administrative Code to implement and interpret AS 16.05. and AS 16.43., as follows:

- 1) to clarify that halibut may be taken on salmon hand or power troll gear under either an interim-use or entry permit;
- 2) to establish a gear code for institutional gear which includes all legal gear types used in a special harvest area or by an educational permittee;
- 3) to provide for refunds of interim-use permit fees in certain circumstances;
- 4) to include the loss or theft of an interim-use permit card under the same procedures as established for entry permit cards;
- 5) to provide for refund of entry permit renewal fees if the fishery is closed for the entire season;
- 6) to place responsibility for mailing completed request for duplicate forms and emergency transfer forms on commission agents, with postage supplied by the permit holder;
- 7) to require submission of the complete sales or transfer agreement with a request for permit transfer;
- 8) to establish procedures for the revocation of an emergency transfer;
- 9) to exempt partners from the presumption that a permit transfer between them is pursuant to a lease or retained right of repossession;
- 10) to allow eligible co-signers on a state loan to pledge permits as collateral and to assume primary responsibility for the loan if the permit for which the loan is made is transferred into their name;
- 11) to establish a pilot project in Bristol Bay for field authorization of emergency transfers;
- 12) to clarify that heirs will receive title to their permits, but will not be issued permit cards until they are able to fish;
- 13) to remove hearing officers from the requirements of the Administrative Procedures Act governing subpoenas and depositions;
- 14) to define "good cause" in the context of failing to appear for a scheduled hearing;
- 15) to provide an automatic stay of suspension of a permit pending judicial appeal of the suspension order;

16) to allow permit holders to combine two entry permits and thereby be relieved of the area designation requirements; and

17) to move the language requiring completion of the transfer survey into the transfer section of the regulations.
