

Artists proposals requested

Artists' proposals have been requested for a number of works which will be placed at the Palmer Correctional Center with funds made available through Alaska's percent for art program.

Alaska percent for art law, which mandates that at least one percent of the construction costs for public buildings be used for works of art, has placed works in over 50 facilities since 1978.

Four sites for artwork have been identified at the Palmer facility. An exterior sculpture

will be commissioned for the front entrance to the building, designed by CCC Architects of Anchorage and completed last summer.

In addition, three interior works will be purchased or commissioned. One will be installed in the lobby of the medium security section, another on a clerestory wall in the open day room of the building and a third in a dining area of a barracks building. All works must be durable enough to withstand wear and tear.

The State Arts Council pre-

pares a project prospectus for each facility that falls under the percent for art program. A total of \$43,000 is available for artwork at the Palmer Correctional Center.
