

Search Underway For Bravest Dog In 49th State

The annual search for the brightest and bravest dog in Alaska is again underway by the Alaska Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals.

The one selected will be named "Dog of the Year" and will receive a certificate inscribed with his name in a presentation ceremony at the seventh annual SPCA Kimmuk luncheon and fashion show November 6 at the Anchorage-Westward Hotel.

Nominations for the "Dog of the Year" award are being received by the SPCA at Box 776, Anchorage. A nomination may be made by writing a letter to the humane organization describing the incident in which the animal displayed unusual intelligence and courage.

In years past, dogs which have received this honor included one which stopped a motorist and led him to his owner who was gravely ill in his home.

Another dog aroused his young master and two other boys when the cabin in which they were sleeping caught fire.

Both these incidents received nation-wide publicity in newspaper and humane publications.
