

Aliens in Alaska

The Subcommittee on Immigration and Naturalization of the Senate Judiciary Committee recently published a report by the Immigration and Naturalization Service listing all aliens in the United States who reported in January of this year under requirements of the immigration and nationality act.

The report lists 2,822 aliens in Alaska, of which 2,526 are permanent residents. By nationality, the registering aliens were as follows:

Canada 992; Germany 469; United Kingdom 236; Japan 192; Philippines 187; Norway 105; Mexico 87; Sweden 64; France 49; Switzerland 39; Austria 35; Ireland 31; China and Formosa 24; Hungary 22; Denmark 21;

Italy 18; Cuba 16; Australia 15; Finland 14; Yugoslavia 13; Panama 13; Netherlands 12; India 12; Spain 11; Columbia 9; Peru 8; Belgium 7; Iceland 6; Ryukyu Islands 6; Greece 5; Honduras 5; New Zealand 5; Poland 5; USSR 5; Argentina 4; Jordan 4; Kenya 4;

Portugal 4; Chile 3; Ecuador 3; Jamaica 3; South Africa 3; Uruguay 3; Czechoslovakia 2; Dominican Republic 2; El Salvador 2; Iran 2; Latvia 2; Lithuania 2; Nicaragua 2; Bulgaria, Estonia, Ethiopia, Guatemala, Lebanon, Malta, Nigeria, Pakistan, Syrian-Arab Republic, Thailand, Turkey and Venezuela, 1 each.

There were also 23 stateless aliens.
