

"Iñugułiq Kamaksriigalikun" at Kotzebue

The Northwest Arctic School District, serving the NANA Region's public schools, hosted an educational festival in Kotzebue August 22 through 24. "Iñuguliq Kamaksriigalikun" or "Growing Up With Respect" focused on national issues facing rural school districts and provided orientation for new and current staff members on the culture and lifestyle of the area, a history of the Eskimo, new curriculum awareness and involvement.
