

AMU offers first education doctorate

Alaska's first program for persons wanting to earn a doctorate in education began September 1 at Alaska Methodist University in Anchorage.

The program of weekend classes only is designed for working educators and will be conducted by the University of Southern California's School of Education.

The first four-week course, Philosophy of Education, will be

taught by Dr. Robert L. Brackebury of the USC faculty, with enrollment limited to 45 students.

The September course begins a first-ever opportunity for Alaskans to earn an Ed.D. in their home state. Except for a 12-week semester required at USC in Los Angeles, all classes in the program can be taken at AMU.

Those entering now will complete their studies in the summer of 1980.
