

The Papago tribe gets telephones — finally

Papago tribal members may hear an unaccustomed sound on their reservation in southern Arizona next year — the sound of a telephone ringing, according to *Indian News*, published by the Bureau of Indian Affairs.

The Papago Tribal Utility Authority has purchased a Mountain Bell telephone system, which will be expanded to reach about 55 remote villages on the 2.8 million acre reservation by the end of 1988.
