

ATTENTION APARTMENT OWNERS AND CONDOMINIUM ASSOCIATIONS

The Alaska Division of Energy and Power Development has initiated a program to assist apartment buildings with five or more units to decrease energy consumption.

State financed energy audits of multi-family dwellings are available on request from building owners, managers or homeowner associations for a minimal charge of \$5 per apartment to the owner. The audit will include a site visit of the building by a State contracted auditor in which the building's heat loss is calculated and lighting and heating systems are evaluated. Energy improvements will be recommended and pay backs in energy savings determined.

After the audit, the apartment owner or condominium association can apply for a grant or refund for the purchase and installation of energy improvements that are recommended by the audit and pay for themselves in seven years or less in energy savings. The maximum refund or grant is \$200 for each unit.

In addition, the Division of Business Loans offers 5 percent interest loans up to \$5,000 for energy conservation improvements recommended by the audit.

INTERESTED?

Here's how the program works:

1. The building's owner, manager or homeowners association requests an audit from the Division of Energy and Power Development.
2. The Division of Energy contracts with a certified energy auditor to do the audit.
3. The building receives the audit and the owner, manager or association can apply for the grant or refund and low interest loan.
