The aforementioned Federal Revenue Sharing funds in the amount of \$6,872,500 have been appropriated to the Medicaid program through which persons who are eligible for Aid to Families with Dependent Children (AFDC) or Supplemental Security Income (SSI) have their medical costs paid by the State.

This amount was both authorized by the Legislature and approved by the Governor as part of the total operating appropriations shown above in addition to the General Fund amounts.
