People lived in two different worlds. The Bering Strait divided people who have so much in common: clothes, dances and songs, traditions, language, the saltwater of the Arctic Ocean, nature, weather and land.

I am happy, and my village-mates are happy, too, that the things are changing now to the best.

We are so close neighbors and must be good friends. The cooperation will profit both, Alaska and Chukotka.

Perhaps exchanging our experiences we'll be able to solve different problems which are not solved today. The Bering Strait must not divide but join the two coasts, join the peoples of our countries.
