North Eagle River
Access Interchange

Pursuant to Presidential Executive Order 11990, Protection of Wetlands, the Alaska Department of Transportation and Public Facilities provides notice of proposal to place

fill in wetlands within and adjacent to Fire and Carrol Creek. The proposal will extend the existing culvert crossings of the New Glenn Highway and place additional culvert crossings under the frontage road and North Eagle River Access Road extension to the west.

The proposed fill and culverts are required for the construction of a diamond interchange at the intersection of New Glenn Highway and North Eagle River Access Road. Two build alternatives are proposed. Both alternatives are proposed as a diamond interchange and vary only in the manner in which North Eagle River Access Road crosses the New Glenn Highway. Alternative A proposes the North Eagle River Access Road cross over the New Glenn Highway and Alternative B proposed the North Eagle River Access Road cross under the New Glenn Highway. Alternative A is the preferred alternative. The proposed improvements provide the necessary access control needed to implement the New Glenn Highway as a full control access facility with no at-grade intersections.

Approximately 50,000 to 75,000 cubic yards (c.y.) of fill would be placed over approximately 3.7 to 5.0 acres depending on the alternative and design options chosen. The most extensive area of wetlands involvement occurs in the northwest quadrant of the proposed interchange. These wetlands have been classified as Developable under the Anchorage Wetlands Management Plan (AWMP), except of those within 50 feet of the centerline of Fire Creek which are classified as preservation wetlands. Approximately 6,400 c.y. of the fill will be placed over 0.6 acres of preservation wetlands adjacent to Fire Creek. Activities in the developable wetlands will be covered under the U.S. Army Corps of Engineer's Section 404 General Permit. Activities in the preservation wetlands will require a Section 404 Individual Permit.

There is no practical alternative to the proposed construction within the wetlands because the existing highway bisects these areas. Any alignment shift would result in equal or greater wetland involvement as well as increased socio-economic impacts. Means to mitigate detrimental effects of the project on wetlands will be implemented as required.

CHANGES IN THE REGULATIONS
of the
COMMERCIAL FISHERIES
ENTRY COMMISSION

Notice is hereby given that the Alaska Commercial Fisheries Entry Commission, under authority vested by AS 16.43.020 and AS 16.43.110, proposes to adopt, amend and repeal regulations in Title 20, Chapter 5 of the Alaska Administrative Code to implement and interpret AS 16.05 and AS 16.43., as follows:

- (1) to redefine the herring administrative areas in the Bering Sea;
- (2) to clarify that an agent's signature on a permit renewal will not be accepted unless written authorization is submitted;
- (3) to eliminate the use of a permit past December 31 of any calendar year;
- (4) to clarify that applications will be accepted throughout the application period even if the maximum number of permits is exceeded before the application period closes;
- (5) to eliminate the requirement that the permit holder certify to the transferee's present ability to fish;
- (6) to require the applicant and proposed transferee to complete the transfer survey portion of the Request for Permanent Transfer of Entry Permit form;
- (7) to clarify that conditions of a transfer also includes terms of the transfer;
- (8) to restrict fishing with the carbon copy of the Request for Emergency Transfer of Permit form to emergency situations and establish a 14-day limit;
- (9) to establish a 30-day waiting period before a surviving spouse can apply for transfer of an entry

- permit by right of survivorship;
- (10) to clear up an ambiguity in the term "authorized representative";
- (11) to include oral appearance hearings under the default rule;
- (12) to eliminate confidentiality of certain transfer documents;
- (13) to clearly authorize the release of certain confidential documents to law enforcement agencies and in commission hearings;
- (14) to exempt salmon set net and AYK skiffs from the licensing requirement;
- (15) to provide notice that making false statements constitutes a crime; and
- (16) to clarify what the date of permit or vessel license issuance or renewal is.

This action is not expected to require an increased appropriation.

Notice is also given that any interested person may present oral or written statements or arguments relevant to the action proposed at a public hearing which will be held on Tuesday, October 25, 1983 at 7:30 p.m. in the Turnagain Room, Anchorage Westward Hilton Hotel, Anchorage, Alaska.

The Kodiak Island Borough will accept written proposals until 3:00 p.m., October 18, 1983 for providing and installing two 150 kw diesel generator units to replace those units presently installed in the village of Akhiok power building. Proposals will include credit for the existing units which will be removed from the village.
