

Moses chosen White House fellow finalist

Mary W. Moses, of Tanana, coordinator for the Johnson-O'Malley Education Program of the Fairbanks Native Association, has been named one of 37 national finalists for the 1977-78 White House Fellowship program.

The White House Fellowship program, established to provide outstanding young Americans between the ages of 23 and 36 with firsthand experience in the process of governing the nation, provides such work assignments to individuals selected as assistants to the Vice President,

members of the Cabinet and White House staff as well as off-the-record sessions with key government officials.

Finalists include persons from such occupations as attorneys, state and local government officials, university professors, bankers, and military officers. Ms. Moses is the only education program administrator chosen as a finalist.

Following interviews with the finalists in May, the President's Commission on White House Fellowships will nominate from 14 to 19 persons for the program.
