

Alphonse Demientieff Passes Away

Alphonse Demientieff, 69, a widely known Native craftsman, died Easter Sunday at his home in Nenana.

Mr. Demientieff had been working in his crafts shop just prior to his death in the afternoon. He often made birch dog sleds which were sought by the

top dog mushers in Alaska.

Born in Holy Cross, Mr. Demientieff spent much of his youth there, fishing, hunting, trapping and working on steamships. He moved his family to Nenana in 1945 where he piloted boats on the Tanana and Yukon Rivers.

Most recently he captained the motor vessel "Taku Chief," a familiar sight on the Interior

river systems.

Mr. Demientieff built and raised the tripod each spring for the Nenana Ice Classic. He served during the 1960s as chief of the Village of Nenana and contributed to the historic struggle that resulted in the Native land claims settlement.

Survivors include his wife Mary, to whom he was married

47 years; one sister, Dina Jensen of Nenana; one brother, Dick Demientieff of Holy Cross, five sons, four daughters, 25 grandchildren and three great grandchildren. Mitch Demientieff, a grandson, served as president of the Tanana Chiefs Conference in 1973-74.

Funeral services were held Wednesday at the George Hall, Nenana.

ARTTC Is Unique

NOORVIK — The Alaska Rural Teacher Training Corps, (ARTTC) is a unique program. Rather than have students go to the classroom in their last year to be involved in the classroom, ARTTC corpsmen work in classrooms — four years from the time they are freshman to their senior year.

ARTTC was formed because the universities were looking for a better way to educate teachers going into rural villages. A typical view of a typical ARTTC team may be viewed in Noorvik.

The team meets at least three times a week to work on coursework, sent from U of A and AMU previous homework assignments are discussed, if the need arises, then handed in to the team leader, Dr. Mike Cline, to be sent in to the university professors.

The team members Lulu Nazuruk, Eileen Maclean, Gordon and Ruth Newlin and Don work in the classrooms with cooperating teachers.

These individuals and team leader are active in school and community activities. This year Eileen has taught home economics to the ninth grade girls and is also a member of the advisory school board. She is in the junior level.

Lulu has gotten the Noorvik community library going. She has finished her student teaching and will graduate this August and she hopes to teach here in Noorvik.

Gordon, a sophomore, assisted the Head Start director to get the Head Start going this year and is currently working in the classroom of Dottie Cline teaching spelling.

Ruth is a freshman: She is in the classroom teaching reading to fourth graders. She is doing a great job at it.

Last, but not least, is Don, he coached the elementary basketball team to a 5-3 record. He is also the ARTTC team representative to the ARTTC panel and is on the high school planning committee.

The team is involved in many community affairs. He is a sophomore.

Our team leader, Dr. Mike Cline, assists in the course work, teaches courses himself, and helps out in the classroom and is the chairman of the high school planning committee.

There was a proposed expansion for ARTTC next fall but this may not be possible because of lack of funding from legislature. Words can't express my feelings if for lack of funding.

The ARTTC program is destroyed. Since I've been in the program I've learned many things such as different types of classroom approaches, planning of schedules, developing your own style of teaching, working out curriculum for students, ordering books, things that are essential to teaching in the bush.

I also had the opportunity to coach the Noorvik Warriors, an elementary basketball team here in Noorvik to second place in

the Kotzebue tournament.

The college courses I'm taking on site enable me to further my academic education while doing things in the school and the community. I get along fine in school and the community. I'm bilingual, speak my Native language and English, which is an advantage over incoming teachers from the Outside. I know my culture, the people, our way of life and I'm happy to be part of it.

NOTICE OF FILING OF UTILITY TARIFF REVISION

THE ALASKA PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION hereby gives notice of the filing of a tariff revision by FORT YUKON UTILITIES (TA3-63) for the purpose of including an automatic fuel cost rate adjustment clause in its tariff. This clause would allow the utility to change its electric rates to reflect increases or decreases in the price of fuel oil used by that utility for generating electricity.

Adjustment of rates would be accomplished by adding either a surcharge or a credit to each customer's bill. The surcharge rate would be computed according to the following formula in which the Base Period would be November 1, 1972, to November 1, 1973: Surcharge (cent/KWH) equals Current Fuel Cost (cent/Gal) minus Base Period Fuel Cost (cent/Gal) divided by Average No. of KWH Sold per Gal of Fuel Consumed during latest 12 months.

According to data provided by the utility the Base Period fuel cost was 39.86 cents/Gal and has currently reached 49.4 cents/Gal. During the past 12 months the KWH/Gal factor has averaged 8.81, thus a surcharge in the amount of 1.08 cents/KWH sold is indicated.

Any interested party may file with the Commission by 4:30 p.m., April 30, 1974, a statement of his views and specific reasons in favor of, or in opposition to, the above described tariff revision, together with written confirmation that the same statement has also been mailed or delivered to the utility which filed the tariff revision.
