

Law school pre-course offered to Natives

An opportunity for people interested in pursuing a law school education is being offered this summer in the form of a four-week Pre-Law School Introductory Program (PLSIP). It will be held in Anchorage from July 14-August 8 (dates being subject to change on demand). The major focus of the program will be toward Alaska Native college undergraduates, however college graduates and other interested applicants will be considered as well.

The object of the program will be to introduce participants to all aspects of law school requirements. Emphasis will be placed on familiarizing students with application procedures for the Law School Admission Test (LSAT) and for various law schools. Follow-up assistance will be given in those areas during the next year. Special training will also be provided in the areas of language, writing, and analytical skills, all of which are necessary in preparing for the Law School Admission Test. By offering the course to undergraduates, the skills they learn can be practiced and improved during the next school year.
