TO: The class of persons consisting of all non-whites whom New England Fish Company ("NEFCO") employed during the period from January 30, 1973 to November 8, 1976.

Purpose of this Notice. There currently is pending before this Court a lawsuit involving claims asserted by the aforementioned class against NEFCO's trustee in bankruptcy, Sam Rubinstein (John Berg, Alaska, Inc. ("Ocean Beauty") and (ii) against NEFCO's trustee in bankruptcy, Samuel Cabanis, Jr., Joseph C. Cenedia and Samuel Strauss. This notice is to inform you of the pending proceedings and to outline certain rights you have and steps you may take if you wish.

Background. In a manner, separate case, United States District Judge John J. Shonnard found that NEFCO discriminated against the class on the basis of race in job allocation and promotion, and an opportunity to sue NEFCO has been awarded to the class. He has not yet decided what relief he will award to the class or to individual class members. Pending the pendency of that case, NEFCO filed this bankruptcy.

Summary. Description of the Bankruptcy Case. As a result of NEFCO's bankruptcy liquidation, Trustee, Sam Rubinstein, has been asked to authorize the class to authorize the Trustee to sue NEFCO on behalf of the class. The class representatives assert that Ocean Beauty discriminated against the class on the basis of race in job allocation and promotion, and an opportunity to sue NEFCO has been awarded to the class. He has not yet decided what relief he will award to the class or to individual class members. Pending the pendency of that case, NEFCO filed this bankruptcy.

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If you desire to take any of the steps outlined above, you must advise by written communication to the Court no later than September 25, 1981. The Court otherwise allows upon appropriate application. Your communication should specify clearly the steps you wish to take and should be addressed to:
