## Inflammatory comments blasted

At the conclusion of the two-day meeting in Tok last week, the Board of Directors of the Rural Alaska Community Action Program (RurAL CAP) passed a resolution ruging the Governor to "order a halt" to inflammatory comments against subsistence, subsistence users, and organizations designed to protect subsistence emanating from his Administration.

It further calls on the Governor to "take appropriate steps to discipline" any member of his Administration who persists in making such remarks in the future.

The resolution points out several recent attacks on subsistence organizations perpetrated by the Fish and Department of Game and the Board of Game. These include (but are not necessarily limited comments by Game Division Director Summerville before the Alaska Outdoors Association, Board of Game member Jim Rearden's comments to the Associated Press alleging that subsistence was not "issue," and a recent letter transmitted to Nunam Kitlutsisti by the Deputy Director of the Division of Game, Bob Hinman accusing Nunam Kitlutsisti Director Harold Sparck of "gross mis-statements."

The Board concluded that this series of outbursts from the ADF&G constitututed nothing less than an all out attack on the subsistence needs of rural Alaskan peoples.

Also, the Board was most concerned that the escalation of negative rhetoric from the Department of Fish and Game is drawing attention from the real issues (effective and sound

management of renewal resources in the State of Alaska).

The text of the resolution reads as follows:

## ENTITLED:

URGING THE GOVER-NOR OF THE STATE OF ALASKA TO TAKE STPES TO HALT INFLAMMA-TORY LANGUAGE AND PERSONAL ATTACKS BY HIS DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME

## WHEREAS:

The Board of Directors of the Rural Alaska Community Action Program represents low-income and rural Alaskans throughout the State of Alaska; and,

WHEREAS: a major prioity of that Board, as expressed to it by rural village people, has been the protection of the subsistence way of life constrained only by sound fish and game management practices; and,

WHEREAS: it is essential for all parties interested in the sound management of renewable resources in the State to work together in a continuing and constructive dialogue in order to arrive at sound management plans concerning the allocation of subsistence resources; and,

WHEREAS: various representatives of the ALaska
Department of Fish and G
Game have, on several recent occasions, been making
inflammatory remarks and
personal attacks on subsistence advocates (specifically) and all subsistence users
(by implication), thereby
obviating the possibility of
constructive dialogue on
these issues; and,

WHEREAS: these remarks have contained personal, vindictive attacks on subsistence advocacy groups and their employees, and have gone virtually unchallenged by the Governor's office;

WHÉREAS: the net results of these remarks and letters is that a polarization of user groups is occurring, preventing the formulation of sound management plans for ALaska's critically important subsistence

resources; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED: that the
Board of Directors of the
Rural Alaska Community
Action Program does hereby urgently request Governor Jay Hammond to
immediately and publicly
order a halt to such inflammatory language and personal attacks emmanating
from the Department of
Fish and Game; and, be it
further

RESOLVED: that the Governor is likewise urged to take appropriate steps to discipline any member of his Administration who may persist in making such remarks in the future.
