ANCHORAGE — Alaska native enrollment offices in Anchorage will be open for six days a week through March 30

in a final effort to enroll all eligible persons. Enrollment coordinator John Hope said additional staff had been put on the job to handle any persons wishing to enroll during business hours Monday through Friday or Saturday 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.

With about five weeks left to enroll, Hope said there has been a steady flow of people into the ANE office at 16th and C streets

to get their applications in order. Persons with a question about their applications may check with the enrollment office for their village or region to make sure their name is on the list of applications received.

Enrollment forces are also being enlarged outside Alaska, where in addition to enrolling each person is being asked to vote on the proposed 13th corporation. No exact count has been taken yet of the number of persons who would prefer to be in the 13th corporation.


