Notice is given that the State Board of Education, acting as the State Board of Vocational Rehabilitation Under AS 23.15.010, under authority vested by AS 23.15.020, proposes to repeal, adopt and amend regulations in Title 4, Chapter 54 of the Alaska Administrative Code, dealing with the State Plan for Vocational Rehabilitation and the Business Enterprises Program, to implement and interpret AS 23.15.100 - 23.15.200 as follows:

1) 4 AAC 54.101 is amended to adopt by reference the most recent three-year State Plan for the Vocational Rehabilitation Services Program and State Plan Supplement for the Support Employment Services Program under the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended.

2) 4 AAC 54.300 is amended by clarifying the scope of the regulations in 4 AAC 54.300 - 54.340. They will be applicable to the Business Enterprise Program, including both the Randolph-Sheppard Vending Facility Program under P.L. 93-565, as amended, and the State Vending Facility Program under AS 23.15.100(b), and AS 23.15.130.

3) 4 AAC 54.305 is added to adopt by reference a Policy and Procedure Manual to govern the Business Enterprise Program. The manual will contain a comprehensive revision of policies and procedures formerly addressed by 4 AAC 54.350 - 54.480, which are proposed to be repealed. The manual will be complete revision of the current rules and is adopted by reference because of its length.

4) 4 AAC 54.310 is repealed and readopted to revise the eligibility criteria for participation in the Business Enterprise Program. Revisions include new requirements that the applicant be physically present in Alaska; have completed a vocational evaluation to determine aptitude for managing a vending facility; have transportation to and from the prospective work place; show evidence of good personal hygiene and grooming, and submit an application to the program.

5) 4 AAC 54.320(3) relating to training of vending facility managers, is amended to clarify that vending facility manager training may include training in sanitation.

6) 4 AAC 54.330 relating to certification of trained vending facility managers, is repealed.

7) 4 AAC 54.340, relating to licensing of trained vending facility managers, is rewritten to provide different licensing criteria for individuals trained under 4 AAC 54.320 and for individuals currently licensed in another state.

8) 4 AAC 54.350 - 54.480, dealing with operation of the Business Enterprise Program and procedural rights of licensees is repealed. The matters addressed by those regulations are to be addressed in manual adopted under 4 AAC 54.305.
