This contract provides for the construction of kitchens in schools at Kokhanok, Pitkas Point, Russian Mission, Anvik, Fortuna Ledge, Pedro Bay, Ivanof Bay, Platinum, Clarks Point, False Pass, Nelson Lagoon, Holy Cross, Anaktuvuk Pass, Mentasta Lake, Minto, Chistochina, Koyukuk, Gakona, Dot Lake, Kennx Lake, Northway, Healy, and in a training unit to be located at the Department of Education offices in Anchorage.

The kitchens are scheduled for installation in all schools during the coming school term.
