

RURAL CAP TRAINS NAKAK ON HOUSING PROGRAM

The primary purpose of this program is to give training in the development of housing programs for low-income people.

During the next four months under the sponsorship of the Rural Alaska Community Action Program and the Greater Anchorage Area Community Action Agency, Nakak will receive further training in becoming familiarized with the various housing programs available in Alaska and the criteria for the implementation of these programs.

This will entail spending a considerable amount of time working with such agencies as Alaska State Housing Authority, Housing and Urban Development, Federal Housing Administration, Anchorage Borough Planning Department and the Federal Field Committee.
