

Federal workers compete for award

What does it take to win the Federal Employee of the Year Award? If the records of the past winners are any guide, cost savings to the taxpayer, high performance in unusual circumstances and innovation are three key ingredients.

More than 50 federal agencies in Southcentral Alaska are in the process of selecting their top performers of 1988 to compete for the honor.

One winner in each of four categories will be selected by a panel of judges from the community. Categories are based on federal pay grades so that employees at all levels may be recognized for their service.

The winners will be feted at a March 29 luncheon sponsored by the Federal Executive Association of Anchorage at the Hotel Captain Cook at 11 a.m. Tickets are on sale at all federal agencies for \$14 per person.
