

State Museum: Urgent Reminder To Photographers

The Alaska State Museum today issued an urgent reminder to all Alaskan photographers. The deadline for entry in the third annual State-wide photographic exhibit is May 25, according to Director Michael Kennedy.

"In the most photogenic of all states, where almost everyone carries a camera, we've suddenly discovered a reluctance. Perhaps people have simply not been watching the calendar," Kennedy said.

"We have an outstanding juror in Mary Randlett, capable of providing a valuable critique for all photographers who will exhibit here in June. We have a choice exhibits area ready and waiting for the June showing.

"Now we need photographs in quantity and quality," Kennedy stated, "not only insuring a deservedly great exhibit here, but to be certain that ALASKA POSITIVE 1972 will represent the best traveling exhibit ever to tour Alaska."

Juror Randlett, a top-flight professional of Washington, will individually critique all entries between May 25, the deadline for entries, and the opening of the exhibit at the State Museum, Juneau, at noon on June 4.

Space is available for hundreds of photographs. From these a quality collection will be picked to tour Alaska from August 1 to January 1973, the State Museum Director said.
