Sealed bids in single copy for furnishing all labor, equipment, and materials, and performing all work for Project LSF-035-2(2), Kashwitna Lake and Sustina River, Roadside Beautification, near Kashwitna, Alaska, described herein, will be received until 11:00 a.m. PST, November 10, 1966, in the Commissioner's Office, Island Center Building, Douglas, Alaska.

This project will consist of constructing a parking area at Kashwitna Lake, and a major rest area, complete with picnic tables, fireplaces, water supply, and sanitary facilities, at the Sustina River crossing of the Anchorage-Fairbanks Highway at Mile 71.4.

Principal items of work consist of the following: 24,700 yards of borrow; 1,500 cubic yards of subbase, grading A; Furnishing and planting 100 trees; Construct, 6 class 1 picnic tables, 6 fireplaces, and 2 single seat pit toilets; Furnishing hand pump and appurtenances for the existing well at the Sustina rest area; and other miscellaneous items. All work shall be completed by August 30, 1967.

SEALED BIDS, in duplicate, subject to the conditions within the contract documents, will be received in the office of the Commissioner, Department of Public Works, Juneau, Alaska, until 10:00 a.m., PST, December 1, 1966, at which time and place they will be publicly opened for furnishing all labor and equipment and performing all work in connection with the Sika Airport Project, Stage II, REHABILITATION OF THE SALT WATER FIRE PROTECTION SYSTEM, at Mt. Edgecumbe, Alaska.

Plans, specifications and project documents may be reviewed at the Alaska Department of Public Works, Juneau; the Division of Aviation, 4510 International Airport Road, Anchorage; the Construction Plan Bureau, Fairbanks; and the Associated General Contractors offices in Anchorage, Fairbanks, and Seattle. Plans, specifications and contract documents may be obtained from the Director, Division of Aviation, 4510 International Airport Road, Anchorage, Alaska.

The bid proposal consists of one item: Rehabilitation of Emergency Salt Water Fire Protection System. The item is to be bid on a lump sum basis and includes but is not limited to furnishing and installing the following: one (1) single stage steam turbine; one (1) centrifugal fire pump, steam turbine driven; one (1) vehicle turbine fire pump, electrically driven, approximately 50 H.P. of 6" CI pipe; and all fittings, valves, and other appurtenances necessary to provide a complete and operating facility.

Electrical work performed under this contract shall be done by a firm licensed to perform such work in the State of Alaska.

The attention of bidders is directed to the President's Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965. In connection with the requirements of the foregoing, bidders must complete the statement furnished in the Bid proposal relating to non discrimination and submit it as part of the Bid Proposal. Bids not containing the completed statement will be judged non-responsive and will not be read.

Guarantee will be required with each bid in an amount not less than ten (10) percent of the total bid in accordance with the Instructions to Bidders. Bids must be submitted on the proposal form, and the successful bidder will be required to execute the standard form of contract for construction. The right is reserved, as the interest of the State of Alaska may require, to reject any and all bids; to waive any informality on bids received; and to accept or reject any items of any bid unless such bid is qualified by specific limitation.
