SEALED bids in single copy for
furnishing all labor, materials, and
equipment and performing all work
for Project F-035-4(7), Hurricane
Gulch to East Fork, described herein,
will be received until 2:00 p.m., pre-
vailing time, June 19, 1969, in the
Commissioner's Office, Department
of Highways, Island Center Building,
Douglas, Alaska.

Construction will consist of grad-
ing and drainage of 10.88 miles of
roadway and construction of a com-
posite steel and concrete bridge 121
feet long with a clear roadway width
of 41 feet. This project is located
approximately 104 miles north of
Willow, Alaska, on the Palmer-Cant-
well Highway.

Principal items of work consist of
the following: 202 areas of clearing
and grubbing; 1,185,000 cubic yards
of unclassified excavation; 131,000
cubic yards of borrow and 194,000
cubic yards of selected material; 447,
600 cubic yard miles of overhaul;
50,300 cubic yards of subbase, grad-
ing A; 3,550 linear feet of pipe con-
duit ranging in size from 24 inch to
48 inch in diameter inclusive; 864
linear feet of Structural Plate Pipe
ranging in size between 60 inch and
120 inch diameter, inclusive; 168
linear feet of 11'-5" span, 7'-3" rise,
structural plate pipe-arch; approxi-
mately 177 cubic yards of Class A
concrete, 36,000 pounds of reinforc-
ing steel, and 77,000 pounds of struc-
tural steel; 455 linear feet of struc-
tural steel piles; and miscellaneous items
of work.

All work shall be completed by
October 1, 1971.

Plans and specifications may be

need for them for bidding purposes
from the Commissioner of Highways.
Plans may be examined at Depart-
ment of Highways District Offices in
Anchorage, Fairbanks, Juneau, and
Valdez.

After 35 Years— Breitweiser Retiring

Lieutenant General Robert A.
Breitweiser, commander in chief,
Alaska, announced this week his
intention to retire July 31 after
35 years of military service.

General Breitweiser assumed
the duties of the highest military
post in Alaska June 30, 1967.

Before coming to Alaska, Gen-
eral Breitweiser had been com-
mandant of the Air War College
at Maxwell Air Force Base, Ala.

His retirement will close a
military career which began in
1934 when he entered the United
States Military Academy at West
Point by competitive examina-
tion. He was graduated third in his
class in 1938.

During his two years in Alas-
ka, General Breitweiser became
deeply involved in the Alaskan
community, actively supporting
state efforts in many areas in-
cluding conservation, native hir-
ing and others.

He directed the combined mil-
itary support of rescue efforts
during the Fairbanks flood, re-
ceiving the thanks of Governor
Walter J. Hickel, the Alaska Leg-
islature and the city of Fairbanks.

General Breitweiser made no
announcement of his post-retire-

He said he and Mrs. Breit-

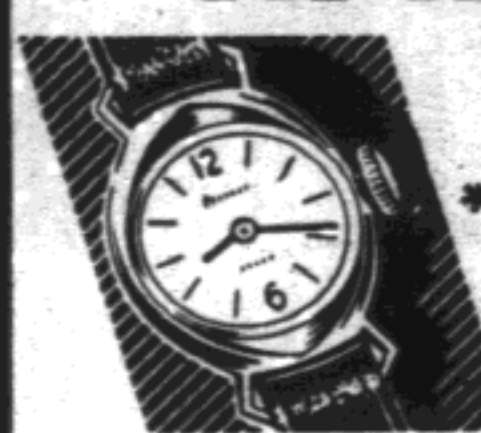
