

The Department of Revenue of the State of Alaska urges taxpayers to file their claims for refund at an early date with the Department of Revenue, Alaska Office Building, Juneau, Alaska.

Due to the accelerated withholding tax provisions adopted by the State in May of 1966, it is expected that the average amount of individual refunds will be slightly larger than those issued for 1965.

The Department of Revenue during 1966, issued 42,571 individual income tax refunds in total amount of \$1,577,488 for an average

refund of \$37.05 for 1965 Alaska Individual Income Tax overpayments.
