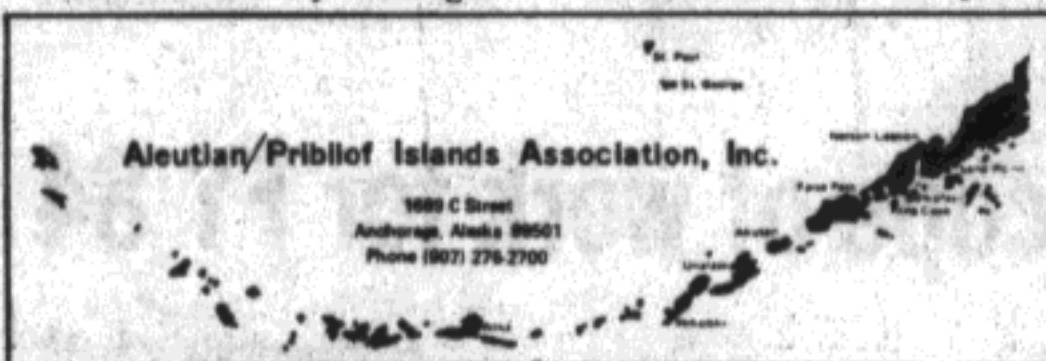
Stress Management Workshop

Anesia Kudrin Memorial Clinic

Even before Akutan was incorporated as a city, the need for a clinic was known. Improving the housing and medical facilities within the community were priority concerns of the residents.

To meet some of those concerns the Alaska State Legislature appropriated \$121,000 to the City of Akutan for construction of a new clinic in the early part of 1980. Aleut Art is Aleuts' Pride

The long-awaited book on Aleut art is here and it is beautiful. Dr. Lydia Black, the author, arrived in Anchorage in mid-February and was honored at a variety of celebrations. Dr. Black is Associate Professor of Anthropology at Providence College in Rhode Island.

Aleut Art, Unangam Aguqa-Aleut Art, Unangam Aguqa-aadangin, a 200-page study of Aleut artistic achievement, published by Aleutian/Pribilof Islands Association, is now available from A/PIA. This major work is the culmination of extensive research under the auspices of the Aleut Cultural Heritage Committee. The project was led by Project Director, Patricia Petrivelli.
