Shorter Enlistment—
Army National Guard

Shorter enlistment obliga-
tions for prospective Army Na-
tional Guard members have been
announced by Brig. Gen. Bruce
I. Staser, Adjutant General of
Alaska.

The new enlistment program
will allow a young man to enlist

in the Guard, receive his special-
ty training, and attend drills and
annual training for only three
years. The remainder of his six-
year military obligation may be
spent in active National Guard
training or in the inactive Army
reserve, at his option.

Until establishment of the
new program, nicknamed the
“3-by 3” enlistment, Guard
enlistees were required to spend
a total of six years with their
Guard units, attending 48 drills
and a 15-day annual training
period each year. The new pro-
gram almost halves that require-
ment.

National Guard recruiters
throughout the state have infor-
mation on the new program,
and young men may contact
recruiters at local armories.
