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to 1920, the population of Barrow was only 380. We as young men used to hunt and shoot ducks just across from Brower-ville. Now right where we used to shoot ducks, there's no ponds there anymore. Lovely, beauti-ful grass were all covered with

Houses across from Brower-ville were little better than 20 or 25 and in Browerville, 17 houses. Now today, there are over 200 houses, still more new houses coming, and population there in village runs to over 2,000, still more new born

babies arrives each month.

One year in 1916, ships that One year in 1916, ships that do bring in supplies for Barrow village, to school manse, church, hospital, and traders, did not come. Those years all these buildings were heated with coal. And that year ships never arrives on account of ice. That summer there's nothing but heavy ice

all over. That our parents donated seal blubbers, oogruk blubbers, whales blubbers and even wood when they have, too. Each time, day after day till Friday, we'd put blubber in stove to keep the room warm. Our teachers Mr. and Mrs. Cram our teachers Mr. and Mrs. Crain sometimes have their parkas on teaching, and in church, Dr. Spence also would wear parka. Sometimes he'd have his hood

on. Still Still we as young people never stopped going to school and to church.

and to church.

That was a tough year for them. It's a long story but I have to stop on this.

Eddie said before 5:00 p.m. they were tolded to check out in Wien's office as they are all going to office as they are all going to Anchorage to have meetings.
