He said there still are several who has never enroll. Make certain that you are in. Eddie said before 5:00 p.m. they were told to check out in Wien's office as they are all going to Anchorage to have meetings. Eddie Hopson, Weslie Aiken, Jacob Adams and Oliver Leavitt from Browerville.

Mr. Archie Brower and Herman Rexford from Barter Island, Zacharias Hugo from Anaktuvuk Pass.

These men took their wives with them as they all going to stay one week in Anchorage.

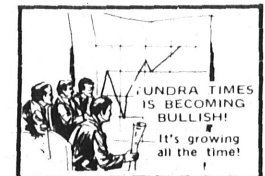
Alaska License Plate Tabs

1973 Alaska license plate tabs will be sold at the College Post Office, the Main Post Office, Airport Road and the Federal Station, 2nd and Cushman from March 22, 1973 through May 31, 1973.

The Post Office will handle only the mail-out registration forms prepared by the state. This form is used to license passenger cars, light trucks, light trailers, motorcycles, and for hire (taxi) vehicles.

The Post Office will not register trucks with weight fees shown on the registration. These will be referred to the Motor Vehicle office.

Early purchase of vehicle license tabs will be appreciated.
