Applications for 1980-81 SEIG grants are available from the Alaska Commission on Postsecondary Education, SEIG Program, Pouch F, Juneau, Alaska 99811. An application must be verified by the postsecondary institution a student, plans to attend before submitting it to the Postsecondary Commission. Contact the Commission for further application procedures and eligibility criteria.

1980-81 SEIG applications must be postmarked by May 31, 1980 for priority consideration. Applications received after that date will receive a lower priority for processing.


