STATE OF ALASKA DIVISION OF RETIREMENT AND BENEFITS NOTICE OF PROPOSED CHANGES IN THE REGULATIONS OF THE GROUP INSURANCE PROGRAM

Notice is given that the Commissioner of the Department of Administration, under authority vested by AS 39.30.090(2), proposes to adopt a regulation in Title 39 of the Alaska Administrative Code, dealing with group insurance coverage for State employees, to implement AS 39.30.090(2), as follows:

- (1) adopt a regulation which will allow the definition of eligible children under a group insurance policy or policies covering State employees to be established by a collective bargaining agreement, and further, for such definition to apply to employees not covered by a collective bargaining agreement. Such an agreement may limit eligible children as to age and/or living arrangements. The initial purpose of this regulation is to allow exemption from coverage under the active employees' health plan for children over age 18, unless the child is a full-time student, in which case coverage will be provided to age 23.

NOTICE OF PROPOSED CHANGES IN THE REGULATIONS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES

Notice is given that the Department of Health and Social Services, under the authority vested by AS 18.06.010, proposes to amend regulations in Title 27 of the Alaska Administrative Code, dealing with Emergency Medical Technicians and Emergency Medical Technician Instructors, Emergency Medical Services Outside Hospitals, Medevac Services, Critical Care Air Ambulance Services, Specialty Aeromedical Teams, Defibrillator Technicians and Approved Training Programs, and adopt a new article dealing with Emergency Medical Services Medical Directors, to implement AS 18.06.082, as follows:

Substantive Proposed Amendments:

Article 1, Emergency Medical Technicians and Emergency Medical Technician Instructors (7 AAC 26.610 — 7 AAC 26.170)

1. 7 AAC 26.030 would give applicants up to one year to demonstrate a need for certification; require that individuals be CPR instructors in order to become certified as EMT-I instructors; and modify the requirements for EMT-III instructor certification.
2. 7 AAC 26.040 would increase the EMT-III scope of certified activities and more clearly state the procedures and conditions for department approval of additional medications and procedures.
3. 7 AAC 26.050 would amend the requirements for entrance into EMT-II and EMT-III training programs, and modify the course approval requirements for EMT-I instructor and EMT-III training programs.
4. 7 AAC 26.080 would amend the qualifications to become a certifying officer and prohibit unauthorized modification of the written and practical examinations for certification.
5. 7 AAC 26.070 would reference the National Standard Training Program EMT-Intermediate and modify the contents of the EMT-III examination.
6. 7 AAC 26.080 would require the applicant to pay a \$15.00 fee for each EMT-I, EMT-II, or EMT-III examination. The fees would be paid to the department and would be used to help offset costs of administering and updating the certification examination system.
7. 7 AAC 26.090 would decrease the number of attempts allowable to pass the practical examination and permit an applicant to take a refresher course and retake rather than retake the entire training program.
8. 7 AAC 26.110 would clarify the CPR requirements for recertification, require that examinations and refresher courses for recertification be taken within the twelve months preceding the date of expiration, and increase the requirements for recertification of EMT-I, II and III instructors.
9. 7 AAC 26.130 would decrease the number of attempts allowable to successfully complete the practical examinations for recertification.
10. 7 AAC 26.140 would add the conviction of a violent or morally reprehensible crime to the list of grounds for which a certificate can be suspended, revoked, or for which the department can refuse to issue a certificate; permit the department to immediately suspend certification of an EMT-I, EMT-II, or EMT-III based on a letter from the sponsoring physician recommending that the EMT be decertified.
11. 7 AAC 26.150 would require that all EMT-I, EMT-II, and EMT-III personnel who are certified in another state pass the Alaska written and practical examinations unless they are certified by the National Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians, and permit the department to issue a temporary EMT-I certificate to an individual who meets certain requirements.

7 AAC 26.170 Definitions

The proposed amendments to this section would delete the definition of "acceptable moral character", amend the definition of "refresher training program", and add several new definitions.

Article 2, Emergency Medical Services Outside Hospitals (7 AAC 26.210 — 7 AAC 26.290)

7 AAC 26.230 would require that all personnel affiliated with a state certified emergency medical service be under the sponsorship of the same physician or physicians and that the person trained to at least to the EMT-I level no longer be required to act as driver of an ambulance.

Article 3: Medevac Services, Critical Care Air

Aeromedical Services, and Specialty Aeromedical Transport Teams Outside Hospitals (7 AAC 26.310 — 7 AAC 26.480)

The proposed amendments to this article would reference the new Article 6 "Responsibilities of Physician Medical Directors."

Article 5: Defibrillator Technicians and Approved Training Programs (7 AAC 26.510 — 7 AAC 26.590)

The proposed amendments to this article would reference a new Article 6 "Responsibilities of Physician Medical Directors."

Article 6. Responsibilities of Physician Medical Directors (7 AAC 26.610 — 7 AAC 26.700)

1. 7 AAC 26.620 would define the qualifications for physician medical directors of certified personnel and services.
2. 7 AAC 26.630 would define which individuals would have a physician medical director and the medical director's responsibilities for each level.
3. 7 AAC 26.640 would define which organization must have a physician medical director and the medical director's responsibilities, including the development of certain protocols.
4. 7 AAC 26.650 would define the qualifications for the position of State EMS Medical Director and his or her responsibilities.
5. 7 AAC 26.660 would list the training programs which require a physician medical director and establish his or her responsibilities for each.
6. 7 AAC 26.670 would state the requirements for a physician who withdraws sponsorship of an EMT-II, EMT-III, or defibrillator technician or state certified emergency medical service or aeromedical service.
7. 7 AAC 26.680 would list the responsibilities which may be delegated by the physician medical director and to whom.
8. 7 AAC 26.690 would state the procedures for authorizing additional medications and procedures for EMTs and prohibit authorization of EMT personnel from performing non-urgent primary patient care.
9. 7 AAC 26.700 would define terms used in article 6 including intervener physician, medical director, on-line physician, and on-site run report.

Notice is hereby given that a SITE and BOUNDARY SURVEY will be performed which will re-establish the limits to where Pigniq Campsites can be located.

Results of the Survey will be made public once completed, and a plan of action to relocate any camps from within the Landmark Boundaries shall be taken.

UIC is requesting the continued cooperation of Barrow residents in protecting this important National Historic Landmark.
