Seventeen Alaskan Native students have proved their interest in getting ahead by enrolling in college courses at Sheldon Jackson College in Sitka.

Sitka and Sheldon Jackson College are located just across a channel from the Bureau of Indian Affairs school at Mt. Edgecumbe and just a short walk after a shoreboat ride brings the students to the college campus.

There, they join more than two hundred other students

studying such varied curricula as Fishing, Forestry and Logging Management, Flight Training, Business Administration and Secretarial Sciences.
