FAIRBANKS – The board of directors of the Alaska Native Foundation, meeting recently in Fairbanks, re-elected Emil Notti to another term as president.

Serving with Notti will be Bryon Mallott, commissioner of Community and Regional Affairs, as first vice president; Vincent Scheurch of Kiana, second vice president; Brenda Itta of Barrow, secretary; and Anchorage attorney Robert Goldberg, treasurer.

The ANF, originally known

as the Charitable Trust and housed in the offices of the Alaska Federation of Natives at Anchorage, gets an annual grant of \$350,000 from the Ford Foundation to assist in implementing the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act.

One of ANF's current projects is devising a model accounting system, in sections, so that any one section or combination of them may be adapted to the needs of a given regional or village Native corporation.
