The Alaska State Council on the Arts is now accepting applications for arts projects to be undertaken during the period July 1, 1980, to June 30, 1981. All interested not-treporth organizations are invited to send proposals to the Council in Anchorage.

In order to be considered with the first round of grant requests, each interested applicant must file, on or before March 31, 1980, a "letter of intent" stating the nature of the project, the total cost of the undertaking, and the grant amount requested of the Council The Council will then send appropriate application forms.

Proposals are accepted throughout the year, but applicants should note that essentially all available grant monies are awarded by the Council at its first grants session, to held June 1980. Any grant requests for funds in excess of \$500 should be received by the March 31, 1980 deadline.

Funding for these grants is made agailable by the State of Alaska and the National Endowment for the Arts. The exact amount of funding available will not be known until after the current legislative

A limited number of entries will be selected by the juror for inclusion in an exhibition to be shown in Fairbanks, Juneau and Anchorage. Of those in the exhibition, one work may receive a Juror's Choice Award of \$1,000. Four works may receive Mert Awards of \$500 each.
