Milepost Once Again on Sale

Started in the mid-1940's as a two-sided map with a few small ads, the MILEPOST is again on sale throughout the North — this time as a 548-page silver anniversary edition.

The 1973 edition of the widely used northland travelers guide published by Alaska Northwest Publishing Co. is 78 pages larger than the 1972 book, according to Bob Henning, editor and publisher.

First concentrating on the Alaska Highway, the MILEPOST has expanded in 25 years to include new highways throughout Alaska, the Yukon and Northwest Territories, British Columbia and northern Alberta, as well as the Alaska Marine Highway System.

Mileage logs and maps are included for Alaskan towns not connected with the main high-way system. The new edition offers a 20-page fishing guide and special sections for hunters and rock hounds.
