BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON,
April 2, 1973 — E. L. Patton,
President of Alyeska Pipeline
Service Company, today made
the following statement after the
Supreme Court's announcement
that it would not review a lower
court ruling that enjoins the
Secretary of the Interior from
issuing permits necessary for
construction of the trans-Alaska

pipeline.

"The effect of the Supreme
Court decision this morning is that
the case is remanded to the
Federal District Court in Wash-
ington, D.C.

"The Supreme Court action
makes it necessary for the Con-
gress to amend the Mineral
Leasing Act of 1920, to clearly

establish the authority of the
Secretary of the Interior to per-
mit use of land outside of the
permanent 54-foot right-of-way
for construction and other pur-
poses.

"The environmental issues
left undecided by the Appeals

Court will require resolution by
the courts or the Congress."

Patton expressed hope that
the obstacles to construction of
the 789-mile crude oil pipeline
would be removed in time for
work on the line to begin at an
early date.
