NOTICE OF PROPOSED REGULATIONS OFFICE OF EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY OFFICE OF THE GOVERNOR

Notice is given that the Office of the Governor, Office of Equal Employment Opportunity (OEEOP) under authority vested by AS 44.19.443, proposes to adopt regulations in Title 6 of the Alaska Administrative Code, dealing with Affirmative Action in State Agencies and Complaints of Employment Discrimination in State Agencies:

- (1) 6 AAC is proposed to be amended by adding a new chapter 96, Affirmative Action in State Agencies, specifying the responsibilities of the Office of Equal Employment Opportunity, state agencies and state employees in implementing the Equal Employment Opportunity Act to ensure fair employment practices and to eliminate barriers to the employment of women and minorities

The regulations prescribed the contents of the Governor's affirmative action plan and state agency affirmative action programs. Methodologies are prescribed for identifying when women and minorities are adversely affected by employment practices and for setting goals to correct disparate treatment. Further, the regulations require that agencies submit specific reports to the Office of Equal Employment Opportunity so that affirmative action efforts can be evaluated, promotions on the agencies' affirmative action goals.

Roles and responsibilities of state officials in implementing the state affirmative action plan are specified in the regulations. The proposal has provisions for considering affirmative action performance in evaluating supervisors for merit increases.

- (2) 6 AAC is proposed to be amended by adding a new chapter 97, Complaints of Employment Discrimination in State Agencies, establishing procedures for the Office of Equal Opportunity to follow in responding to and resolving formal and informal complaints of discriminatory employment practices filed against state agencies. When an informal complaint is filed, the Office of Equal Employment Opportunity mediates between the complainant and the state agency. When a formal complaint is filed, the Office of Equal Employment Opportunity provides technical assistance to the state agency, assures proper investigation of the case and information exchange among agencies such as the attorney general's office, the division of labor relations and personnel, and the state or federal agency handling the formal complaint.

Notice is also given that any person interested may present oral statements or arguments relevant to the proposed action at a hearing to be held in the large conference room, suite 104 of the Alaska Housing Finance Corporation offices, 520 E. 34th St., Anchorage, Alaska, at 9:00am on August 28, 1989. Any person wishing to provide oral statements or arguments by teleconference at the hearing may call 584-9312.

In addition, written statements or arguments relevant to the proposed action may be provided in writing to the Office of the Governor, Office of Equal Employment Opportunity, P.O. Box AE, Juneau, Alaska 99811 so that they are received no later than August 28, 1989.

NOTICE OF PROPOSED CHANGES IN THE REGULATIONS OF THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION

Notice is given that the State Board of Education, under authority vested by AS 14.07.080, proposes to repeal, adopt and amend regulations in Title 4 of the Alaska Administrative Code, dealing with the governing of pupil transportation in the state, to implement and interpret AS 14.07.080 and AS 14.09.010, as follows:

Currently the state is reimbursing a higher rate for transportation services provided by district employees than it is for comparable service provided by contractors. To control costs and to provide for state reimbursements to school districts at reasonable rates for both contracted and district operated school bus services, the proposed regulations provide for the state to reimburse school districts for district operated rates no more than the contracted rate established through the competitive proposal process unless the excess costs are justified.

Pursuant to Section 14(c)(3) of the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act, (ANCSA), 85 Stat. 688, AS 44.47.150(a) and 19 AAC 90.015, Solomon Native Corporation has offered to convey the surface estate of the following described lands to the State of Alaska, in trust, for any future city that might be established in the Village of Solomon, Alaska:

The surface estate of a parcel of land located in Surveyed Township 11 South, Range 29 West, Kasilof River Meridian, Cape Nome Recording District, Second Judicial District, State of Alaska being situated at the Native village of Solomon, Alaska. The parcel is located on the north side of the Nome-Council road and is adjacent to Mineral Survey 1100. The parcel contains approximately 23.4 acres.

A complete legal description and map of the parcel is available for inspection at the Department of Community and Regional Affairs office in Nome and at the Municipal Lands Trustee Program office in Anchorage.

Pursuant to AS 44.47.150(a) and 19 AAC 90.015, the Municipal Land Trust Officer, acting on behalf of the Commissioner of the Department of Community and Regional Affairs, has decided to accept the offer in complete satisfaction of the obligation of Solomon Native Corporation under Section 14(c)(3) of ANCSA. This decision was reached after consultation with the village of Solomon, Alaska, through the recognized appropriate village entity; upon weighing the best interests of those residents and any future city that might be established; and upon an application of the standards in 19 AAC 90.020.
