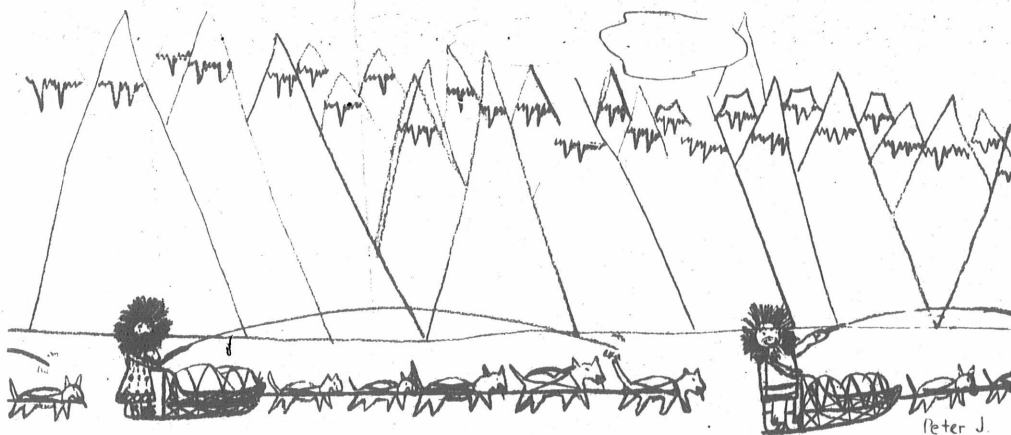


ART OF THE KWETHLUK VILLAGE CHILDREN

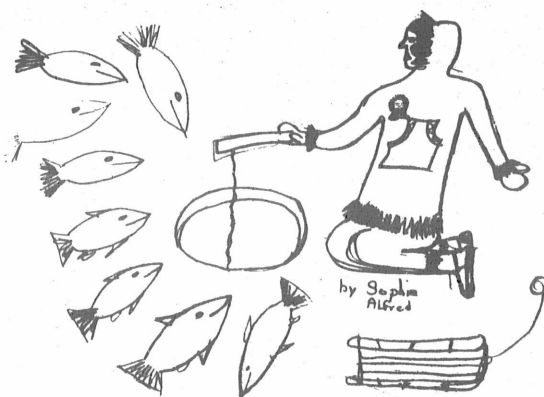
